<p>Following a hurricane, a large emergence of floodwater mosquitoes can occur, interfering with hurricane recovery efforts. Most of these mosquitoes are nuisance mosquitoes and do not carry diseases transmitted by mosquitoes. However, some floodwater species can spread disease. Mosquito control is necessary to PROTECT your community while cleaning up the destruction from a natural disaster. <p>People in communities where diseases transmitted by mosquitoes such as Zika, chikungunya, or dengue are known to be locally spread, may be at a higher risk of getting infected with these viruses after a hurricane or flood. The excess standing water creates extra places for mosquitoes to lay their eggs. PREVENT mosquito populations from developing by draining excess standing water. 



Mosquito control programs PROTECT your community after flooding by controlling adult mosquitoes with an adult mosquito control treatment. During aerial application, only two tablespoons of adult mosquito control treatment is applied to an area the size of a football field. 




